

Vicci Sperry began her career as an avante-garde abstract artist in Chicago in the 1930's. After studying with Hans Hofmann, she became involved in the Greenwich Village ferment of the forties and fifties as a close associate of such noted artists as Franz Kline, William De Kooning, Jackson Pollock and many others. During her long life she was inspired by many of this century's significant art movements, and artists (Matisse, Cezanne) as well as African tribal art.

Vicci Sperry has exhibited in Paris, New York, Los Angeles and numerous other cities in the United States. Her many years of painting, teaching, lecturing and collecting and loving art and artists generated her book entitled *The Art Experience*, which was produced by master printer André Sauret in 1969.

This exhibition chronicles only a portion of a large body of work that was created by Vicci Sperry during her lifetime. The paintings are bold, powerfully passionate and unrestrained. Yet, there is a sense of order, balance, masterful composition and most importantly inspiration.




"Space, being alive,—it has no vacuums and no static area. Whatever we put into space reflects this aliveness and reveals the responding aliveness of the total space."
